Dr. Liu is a medical educator and clinical skills leader with a broad background in undergraduate medical education. He works with learners across the continuum of medical training, from pre-clerkship through advanced clinical training, supporting the development of core competencies in history taking, physical examination, communication, clinical reasoning, and patient-centered care.

As Associate Director of the Clinical Skills Education and Evaluation Center (CSEEC), he supports the design, implementation, and evaluation of clinical skills curricula and assessment programs, including standardized patient encounters, OSCEs, simulation-based education, and structured feedback processes that promote learner growth and performance improvement. He collaborates closely with faculty, clerkship leadership, and standardized patients to ensure high-quality, learner-centered educational and assessment experiences across training levels.

He completed the Master of Academic Medicine program at the Keck School of Medicine of USC in June 2022, which has strengthened his expertise in curriculum development, assessment design, educational scholarship, and program evaluation—enhancing his ability to apply evidence-based approaches to teaching and learning in medical education.

Dr. Liu has also contributed to national medical education scholarship and dialogue through presentations and workshops at meetings such as DOCS, WGEA, and the AAMC, focusing on clinical skills assessment, standardized patient education, clinical reasoning, and remediation practices.

Recently, he has collaborated with the Post-Encounter Note and Remediation of Clinical Skills working groups of DOCS, contributing to ongoing efforts to advance best practices in learner assessment, feedback, and remediation. He also serves as the WGEA Representative, acting as a liaison to ensure the interests, regional needs, and standards of clinical skills educators across the Western United States are represented nationally while fostering collaboration and innovation within the clinical skills education community
